







MICHÈLE REINHARDT



Its aim is to help lawyers work more efficiently, accurately, and devote more time to complex problem solving and high-impact, strategic work.


Prior to joining Legora, Nathalia was Head of Al at Germany's largest law firm.






ROXANA SHARIFI
